# **Summer Plans**

My focus since Lent has been on how to engage folks who for whatever reason can't make it to Sunday morning services as often as they would like. To that end, we have started a Wednesday evening offering we called W.E.E.D.S. – Wednesday Evening Education, Devotion, and Supper. I think, quite frankly, we came up with the acronym and then ret-conned the meaning. No matter. It has been a successful venture. We have met all through the month of May for Eucharist and supper.

But the point of W.E.E.D.S. was not strictly about a Eucharistic service, but as an educational offering to compliment what we were doing on Sunday and Wednesday mornings. I met with several families who I thought would be most interested in such a program, and we decided on Wednesday evenings. We also thought it best for a couple of reasons to begin with a simple Eucharist and then transition to the educational offering.

Still, though, I wanted to be able to offer the Eucharist to those for whom Sunday mornings are not always an option. To that end, we will begin this Sunday, June 3, celebrating the Holy Eucharist an additional time at 4:00 pm. So there will be three opportunities most Sundays to attend church, our regular 8:30 and 10:30 services will remain unchanged but now there is also a 4:00 pm celebration.

Now I will admit, in a perfect world I would rather we would all gather together at one service. Multiple services can end up in effectively multiple parishes with folks who regularly attend one service not really knowing those who attend the other. This has not been the case here at St. James' thus far. Folks are pretty fluid about attending whichever service fits for them and can vary from week to week. That is the best possible situation if we are going to have multiple services. Our prayer book offers a great variety of styles of worship, and I am all about being exposed to all of them. Personally, I don't think we need a new prayer (*continued on page 2*)

book until we have exhausted the current one, and I don't see that happening any time soon.

It has been said that the Anglican Church in general has three kinds of services: low and lazy; broad and hazy; or high and crazy. I take issue with each of these characterizations, but it is amusing. I am a "smells and bells" kind of guy, but I understand that some people do not appreciate certain aspects of such a service (which is a shame because I am pretty sure that is how they do church in heaven). I try to vary our services in such a way as to have opportunity for a wide variety of worship styles without going too far to any particular extreme. That seems very Anglican to me.

There is something for everyone at St. James' whether it is Sunday morning or Sunday afternoon, Wednesday morning or Wednesday evening. Any opportunity I have to gather with the good folks of St. James' is time well spent.

Have you been looking for a meaningful way to get involved in your church? There are many ways to serve each other and our community at St. James. Below is a list of just some of the many ways to contribute your time and talent.

**Worship Leader** – Worship leaders assist with the Sunday services by reading lessons, psalms, the prayers of the people and helping with communion.

**Lay Eucharistic Minister** - LEMS assist with communion. *Father Brandt can answer any questions and guide you if you are interested in these ministries.* 

**Lector** – Lectors read the Old Testament lesson. Lectors are assigned alphabetically and generally may read two or three times a year.

**Usher** – Ushers welcome guests, take up the collection, and assist people up the stairs to communion. Ushers generally serve one Sunday about every 5 or 6 weeks.

*Email <u>Betsy@stjamesgreenville.com</u> if you would like to be a lector or usher and Betsy will add you to the rotation.* 

Altar Guild – The Altar Guild prepares the church for communion on Sundays by polishing silver and brass, changing hymn boards, putting altar linens out and caring for these items. The guild is divided into teams that serve for a week.

Martha Weissinger can explain in detail what is involved in this ministry.

**Pastoral Care** – The pastoral care committee makes meals to take to parishioners in times of need. They send cards to the people on our prayer list and check in on shut-ins. *Bee Stewart and Mary Lynn Andrews can give you all the details on what this ministry involves.* 

Harvest – The Harvest group meets each Monday from Sept. – May for mentally and physically challenged adults. Snacks, activities, and fellowship help enrich their lives. Annis' Children – Annis' Children is involved with helping foster children and parents in Washington County and supporting the social workers who work with them. There are several ways to get involved with this ministry which are outlined on the Annis' Children page (see page 4). *Emily Pieralisi can answer any questions you have about how to help.* 

**Boy Scouts** – St. James' scout troop meets each Tuesday evening from August – May. The Scouts enjoy projects, camp-outs, all the activities you would expect. *Anita and Jim Martin can tell you exactly how you can assist.*
