## Holy Week 2023

The start of April this year brings with it one of my favorite parts of the Christian year: Holy Week and Easter. Holy Week traditions allow us to be immersed in liturgy for a week. Palm Sunday, Maundy Thursday, Good Friday, the Great Vigil of Easter, and Easter Sunday make for a full and inspiring week in the life of the parish.

It begins April 2 with Palm Sunday. Weather permitting, we will gather in the courtyard for the Liturgy of the Palms. We will then process while singing and waving our palm fronds to the front door of the church. There we will pause and pray another collect, marking the transition from the crowd shouting, "Hosannah!" to their shouting "Crucify him!"
Our Holy Week observance continues on Wednesday with the Stations of the Cross. We symbolically travel with Christ through the streets of Jerusalem as he makes his way to Golgotha, stopping at various points to remember events both biblical and traditional.
On Thursday, we will celebrate Maundy Thursday. This service is the beginning of the Triduum of Easter, the "three days." Maundy comes from the Latin word mandatum or commandment. Jesus teaches his closest disciples that he is giving them a new commandment to love one another. Our Lord manifests this command by washing the feet of his disciples. We will wash feet at our service as well. Maundy Thursday also marks the institution of the Lord's Supper. At the end of the service, we will move the remaining consecrated elements to the altar in the chapel area, symbolizing Christ's journey to the Garden of Gethsemane. We will leave in silence after the stripping of the altar.
The service continues the next day with Good Friday. Just as we left in silence the night before, we enter in silence on this day. We kneel in silent prayer and hear again the Crucifixion narrative, this time from the Gospel of John. We then pray the Solemn Collects and spend time in adoration of the Cross. We receive communion from the reserve sacrament and once again depart in silence.
We next gather Saturday evening, once again in the courtyard, for the beginning of the Great Vigil of Easter. A new fire is lit and from it the Paschal candle. We will process into the darkened church, led by the light of Christ symbolized by the candle. We will hear the Exsultet sung as the light of Christ spreads through the darkness. We will read passages from the Old Testament that record God's saving deeds in history. We will then renew our baptismal vows.
After the renewal of our vows, we will light the candles on the altar, turn on the lights, and sing glory to God for the Resurrection of Our (continued on page 2)

Lord Jesus Christ. Our Lord has passed over from Death into Life, from Darkness into Light. And then we will celebrate the first Eucharist of Easter. After the service, we will have a gala celebration in the parish hall.
The next morning, we will gather for the Sunday of the Resurrection. We will have the flowering of the Cross by our children. After the service, we will have an Easter Egg hunt on the lawn.

I urge you to immerse yourself in the events of Holy Week. Attend every service. Experience the rollercoaster of emotion that Holy Week provides. Open yourself up to experiencing God in a way that the rest of the year merely echoes. It is worth the effort.
