We mainly talked about transitioning to a new bishop. This February, the Diocesan Council will elect a new bishop. There are 3-5 finalists who will be announced on November 1. (For the record, I am NOT a candidate for bishop.)

Before the election, there will be a series of "Meet and Greets" at various locations around the diocese. St. James' will host one of these sessions on January 17, 2024, at 6:00 PM. This will be a great opportunity not only to meet the bishop candidates, but also to have folks from all over the Delta and north Mississippi come visit us here at St. James'.

November always seems to be an exciting time here in the parish, and I am glad to see it arriving.

### Whom do you wish to remember on All Saints Sunday, Nov. 5?

All Saints Sunday is a traditional time in our church for remembering the total communion of saints and the corporate realization of salvation in that heavenly country "where there shall be no more mourning nor crying nor pain any more (Rev. 21:4)."

The Feast of All Saints, one of the seven principal feast days of the church year, is believed to have originated in the British Isles and therefore is characteristically Anglican. In most Episcopal Churches, the names of those who have died within the last year are read aloud during the liturgy by the celebrant, as well as the names of other saints (loved ones) submitted by members of the congregation, regardless of the date of their deaths.

### **Annual Parish Meeting is Nov 19**

The Annual Parish Meeting has been set for Nov 19 during the 10:30 church service. It is time for vestry nominations. We will be electing a Sr. Warden and 3 vestry members. These are the guidelines for a vestry member at St. James:

A vestry person is:

- 1. a confirmed communicant of St. James' for at least one year
- 2. faithful in working, praying, and giving for the spread of the Kingdom of God
- 3. regular in worship and active in parish activities
- present at all vestry meetings except in the case of emergencies
- 5. at least 21 years old
- 6. has not served on the vestry for at least one year

Vestry members whose terms are ending are:

Leigh Harris - Sr. Warden, Austin Frye, Graham Hollister, and Charlie Weissinger. We thank them for their faithful service to St. James. They will form the election committee for this year's election.

There are a couple of ways you may nominate someone for Vestry:

- 1. You may call a member of the election committee. Remember, you must have that person's permission in order to nominate them.
- 2. You may e-mail betsy@stjamesgreenville.com with your nomination. You may nominate yourself by either means.
