ANNUAL PARISH MEETING

Annual Parish Meeting is Nov 10

The Annual Parish Meeting has been set for Nov 10 during the 10:30 church service. It is time for vestry nominations. We will be electing 3 vestry members. These are the guidelines for a vestry member at St. James:

A vestry person is:

- 1. a confirmed communicant of St. James' for at least one year
- 2. faithful in working, praying, and giving for the spread of the Kingdom of God
- 3. regular in worship and active in parish activities
- 4. present at all vestry meetings except in the case of emergencies
- 5. at least 21 years old
- 6. has not served on the vestry for at least one vear

Vestry members whose terms are ending are: Debi Hendrix, Rak Koestler, and Beth Naaman. We thank them for their faithful service to St. James. They will form the election committee for this year's election.

There are a couple of ways you may nominate someone for Vestry:

- 1. You may call a member of the election committee. Remember, you must have that person's permission in order to nominate them.
- 2. You may e-mail betsy@stjamesgreenville.com with your nomination. You may nominate yourself by either means.

We require a brief biographical sketch of your nominee to include in the printed material for the meeting (how long a member, committees, activities involved in, etc.). Please e-mail it to betsy@stjamesgreenville.com.

Whom do you wish to remember on All Saints Sunday, Nov. 3?

All Saints Sunday is a traditional time in our church for remembering the total communion of saints and the corporate realization of salvation in that heavenly country "where there shall be no more mourning nor crying nor pain any more (Rev. 21:4)."

The Feast of All Saints, one of the seven principle feast days of the church year, is believed to have originated in the British Isles and therefore is characteristically Anglican. In most Episcopal Churches, the names of those who have died within the last year are read aloud during the liturgy by the celebrant, as well as the names of other saints (loved ones) submitted by members of the congregation, regardless of the date of their deaths.
